Helping Your Child Become More Resilient

Resilience means being able to bounce back after things go wrong. It helps children stay strong when life gets tough. Here are some simple ways you can help your child build resilience at home:

1. Let them try - give your child a chance to solve problems on their own. Offer help if they really need it.
2. Show calmness - when things don't go to plan, show your child how to stay calm and try again.
3. Encourage effort - praise your child for trying hard, not just for getting it right.
4. Talk about feelings - help your child name their feelings and talk about them. Show healthy ways to deal with frustration or sadness.
5. Set small goals - help your child set goals they can reach, one step at a time.

6. Build friendships - encourage your child to spend time with family and friends who make them feel good.

7. Celebrate progress - notice and celebrate the little improvements your child makes.

8. Create safety - make your home a place where your child feels loved and supported.

When children learn to be resilient, they can cope better with stress, change and challenges. Together we can help our children grow strong, confident and ready for anything!

PLAY IS THE WAY

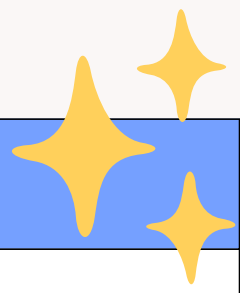






LIBRARY BOOK RETURNS
