Loan Uniforms

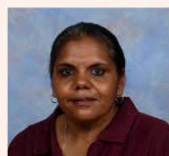

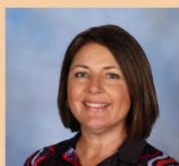

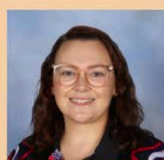

Healthy Lunchbox Recipe

TUNA SUSHI SANDWICHES

Ingredients

95 gram can tuna - or you could use shredded chicken
½ Lebanese cucumber cut into matchsticks
¼ medium carrot, grated or cut into matchsticks
4 slices of wholegrain bread, crusts removed
50 gram Cheese and Chive dip

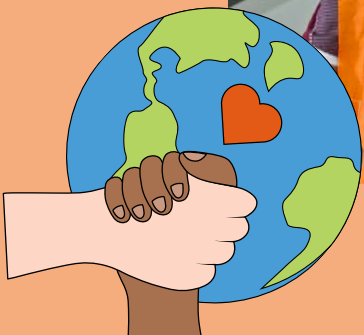
Method

1. Drain and flake tuna. Deseed cucumber. Cut cucumber and carrot into matchsticks.
2. Using a rolling pin, flatten bread slices. Spread dip over bread. Place tuna, cucumber and carrot in rows next to each other on the bread, leaving 1cm border along one edge.
3. Roll bread from opposite edge to enclose filling. Cut each roll into 3 rounds.



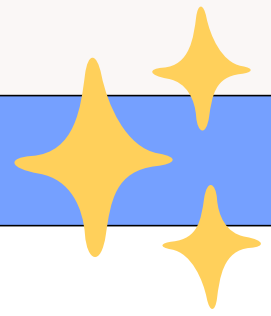
