# Healthy Lunch Box Recipe

## HAM & PINEAPPLE PIZZA MUFFINS

### Ingredients

3 ½ cups self raising flour  
2 cups grated cheddar cheese  
¾ cup vegetable oil  
1 cup tomato paste  
2 eggs  
1 ½ cups milk  
140g ham, roughly chopped  
450g can crushed pineapple, drained

### Method

1. Preheat oven to 180. Line a 12 hole muffin tin with paper cases.
2. Place the flour, 1 cup cheese into a bowl and mix to combine.
3. Place the oil, tomato paste, eggs and milk in a bowl and whisk to combine.

4. Add the egg mixture to the flour mixture and mix until just combined. Fold through the ham and pineapple.
5. Divide the mixture between paper cases and sprinkle with remaining cheese. Bake for 30 minutes.
6. Allow to cool before serving.
